- ▶ 2014: 3,290,050 (-66,602)
- ▶ 2018: 3,529,626 (+239,576) - outpaced population growth by 63,378

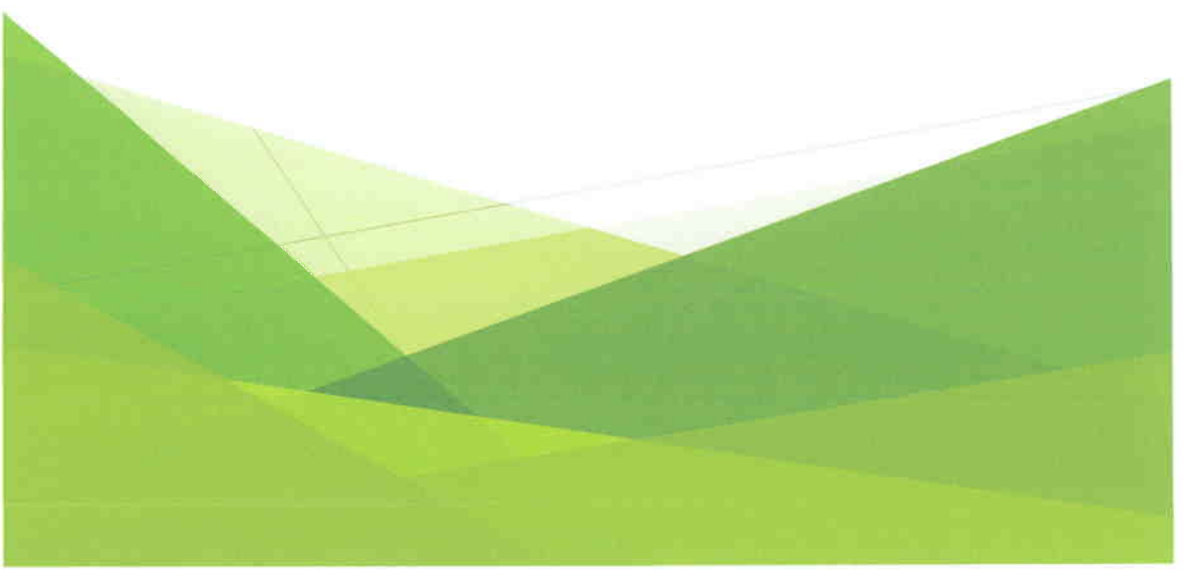

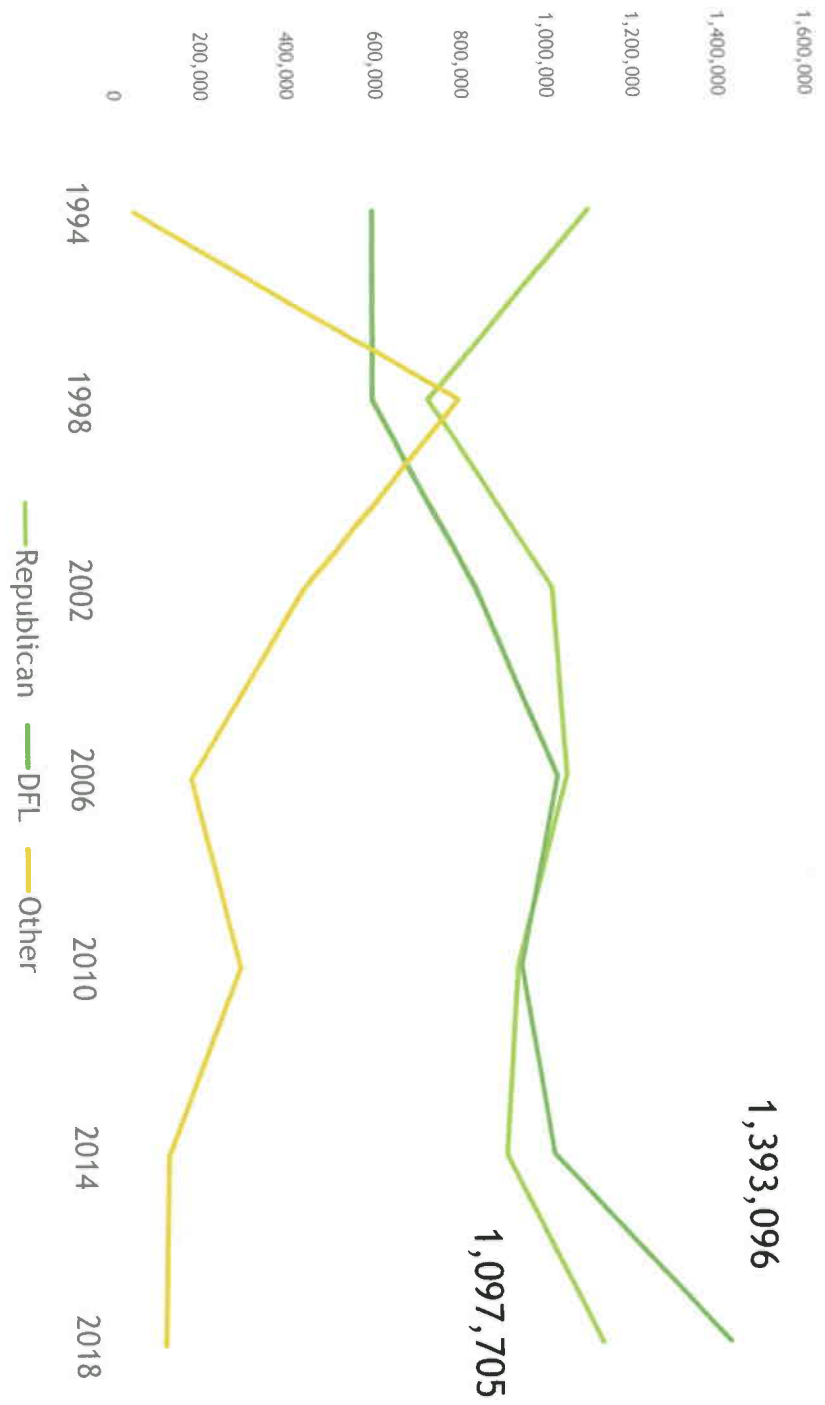
